

What are Joint Visits?



A joint visit is a co-visit with your Primary Service Provider (PSP) and an additional team member. The intention of the joint visit is to share additional expertise and knowledge with you and your child's PSP.

A joint visit provides an opportunity for team members to:

- Observe the strategies you and your PSP are currently using and discuss next steps.
- Problem solve with you and the PSP
- Address your questions related to a specific intervention need.
- Explore and try new intervention strategies or additional ideas.

Joint visits can be scheduled periodically over the course of your child's enrollment in the program. Another team member may join your child's PSP for consecutive visits to provide additional support when learning to implement new strategies or when achieving a developmental milestone.
